As we get more details closer to time, we will pass them along! Register **HERE**.




9 Baskets Donated for The CALL Give-a-wavs



Feelings of Loneliness & Isolation A Message from Rusti Holwick, LPE-I, LADAC, AADC

Many of us experience feelings of loneliness or feeling lonesome, especially during the holiday season. It's common to experience a deep inner sense and feeling of loneliness and feeling included and alone experience are



loneliness and feeling isolated and alone, even when in a crowded room such as a party or gathering with other people even if they are friends and loved ones. You may notice the feeling during daily activities such as driving your car, while working or going through the motions of your day.

This experience can often resemble depressive symptoms with a heaviness, negative and self-deprecating thoughts might occur, feelings of sadness or emptiness and a heavy physical experience as well as a general low feeling or ebb. Sometimes this experience seems to touch and impact our spirit within as an emptiness resulting in feeling spiritually empty and void; being low in spirit.

This phenomenon has been addressed in Existential Theory as a core part of the human condition and reflects this paradox that while we are connected as a human species, each person's subjective internal experience occurs in isolation alone and unique to that individual. A well known Existential statement for example, "Together, we are alone."

In young adults, 57% of 18-24 year olds reported feeling alone in early 2025; a significant increasing trend. One in four young people globally experience loneliness. In adults: around one-third of all U.S. adults experienced loneliness at least once a week in the past year.

Technology is frequently cited as a cause of loneliness for mainstream Americans, although also cited to help maintain relationships. Social media trends with endless scrolling, watching Tik Tok or scrolling on Facebook and/or Instagram with the experience of watching others' lives from a disconnected outside looking-in view, I think, is the element that adds to isolation rather than connection. Even without technology, loneliness is an age-old problem.

Side note: A good book to read for insights into changes in youth with increased anxiety, mental health issues and isolation: The Anxious Generation by Jonathan Haidt.

This topic is easy for me to write about as I experience this from time to time. I am very familiar with the occurrence of feeling internally isolated and alone as I live a busy life with family, friends, a very busy and meaningful work life, exercise, hobbies and all. Even with so many people near me that I love intensely; it's still easy to feel isolated within my mind.

The good news and remedy for this ailment and occurrence is found in the Word of God. The presence of the Lord Jesus Christ and his promise of the Holy Spirit dwelling within each of his children. I am a child of God. I/We are never alone as believers in Jesus Christ.

2 Corinthians 10:3-4(Easy Version) says it nicely: It is true that we live in this world as humans. But we do not use our human ideas to fight against what is wrong. It is like we are fighting in a war, but we do not use human weapons. Instead we use God's weapons. Those weapons are powerful enough to destroy the enemy's strong places. We use those weapons to destroy people's wrong ideas.

These scriptures reminding me of His promises give me hope and peace. They change my perspective and experience to allow me to live more fully in each moment. The Word is alive and helps us to fight the schemes and lies of the evil one. Hope and fulfillment is in The Lord and the Word he's given us.
